Objectives

- Maintain a strong link between FMG and Taratahi Agricultural Training Centre with the promotion of both organisations.
- Promote further tertiary education for those entering the agriculture sector.

Criteria

- Must be enrolled in the National Certificate in Agriculture Level 4 – Sheep, Beef or Dairy Option.
- Must be enrolled at Taratahi's Wairarapa Campus.
- Must submit two page assignment (guidelines on next page).
- Shows passion for New Zealand's rural sector.

Selection

1. Applications are open from 1st February 2018 – 28th February 2018.
2. Interviews take place in March for shortlisted applicants.
3. Taratahi staff hold face-to-face interviews. Those shortlisted are required to attend an interview.
4. Taratahi staff recommend and agree on scholarship winners with FMG.
5. Applicants will be notified of the scholarship winners by the end of April 2018.

Payment

- Three students will receive \$1,000 each.
- Payments will be made into the student's account at Taratahi.
- Payment will be a credit towards students' fees at Taratahi.
